Local pastors reach out to help

Blessed Greetings and our love from Romania!

Earlier this year I brought to you wonderful stories of what our great Lord did through us over the last year and early this year!

This Spring let God warm our hearts in the beauty of His splendor of love and the fullness of life!

Spring time comes with some wonderful needy and humble people who have little projects that are needing a fix and by God's grace we may be able to help as we work together.

Glasses for the Saint Of God, Fixing his Car

Pastor Relu Paraluta gives everything for Christ. He has a large family of seven kids, but along with his wife are always ready to share their piece of bread. Often picking up the morning hen's eggs to share with the hungry poor child of the neighbor or the lonely poor widow across the street. Brother Romulus is the pioneering missionary pastor of the Filiasi region in the most poor province of the country, Oltenia. After they were saved he built up a ministry team recruiting out of the harvest crop of new converts. They planted

and build over a dozen churches in the towns and villages around Filiasi.

This precious brother has a health problem of an eye disease. His eyes, gradually failing, however with special glasses he manages to see. These glasses must be changed every few years as the disease progresses. The glasses costs about \$600, which is about two months of his support.

I pray someone may have mercy and help this wonderful brother, it's a pity to see him reading the scriptures holding his Bible close touching his nose.

Also, just here while writing, I called him, and he gave me the bad news, telling that his only car broke down with engine problems.

Pastor Romulus needs about \$600 to buy the new glasses, and \$450 for the auto repair shop to fix the car.

Maria Almajanu, 68 years old Widow Saint, Eye Surgery

This holy widow is like Anna from Jerusalem, first to be saved and first to serve others, a reliable compassionate lady to minister to the needs of the people and wash the saint's dirty feet.

Though she has little resources, her ministry continues. She washing the feet of the disabled, which doesn't require any money, does it? She cleans and washing the poor orphan kids body and clothing, helping a busy mom to manage her nine little kids. She is there to sweep and mop the church sanctuary, ready for any service she can do.

However, her sight is becoming narrow and dimmer and she may become dependent on others. Today is her turn to get some help; she is in bad need of eye surgery to get rid of the cataract that dim her eyes. The doctor said now before it's too late as a delay may make it too dangerous to do the surgery.

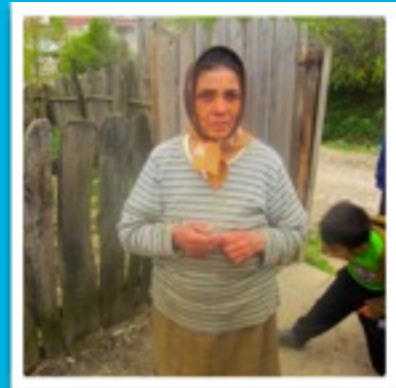
\$500 will do the surgery to save saint's Maria's eyes.

Pastor Costel Building the Home - Needs the Touch of God and Ours

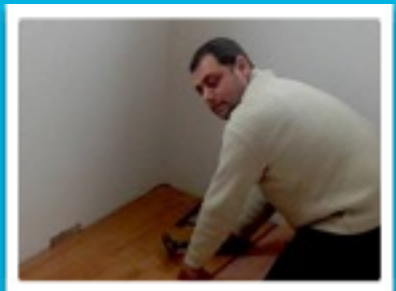

Pastor Costel was discipled and raised up by Pastor Romulus. He serves under him and Romulus often tells me how proud is of him, like; Costel is my right hand, papa John. Costel was the first leader of Romulus on his early missions's team, and today he pastors three new planted churches that he helped to plant. One church is in Cornita town, he built the church building. At first when the



church started he walked about 3 miles back and forth from his home town to Cornita town, until he got a bicycle, and later the Lord blessed him with an old car that is mostly used to give rides to ministry teams from one town to the other on church planting and evangelism. Now the big need, Pastor Costel has seven small kids from twelve to fourteen years old. His old inherited shabby home is too small for the large family. In fact all the children use only one bedroom, and some of the little ones are sleeping with the parents. Pastor Romulus and their ministry team encouraged brother Costel to take a step of faith and dig a home foundation, and together they laid a strong cement foundation, and then little by little as some money comes in, plank wood, brick by brick was set in, but there is still much to accomplish.

There is a need of other \$8000 to finish the home and to make it ready for use.

It'll be a real blessing to see this precious family living in a new spacious home

If you can't give a gift of money, then pray and believe with us, yes that our Lord will supply what's needed.

Ministry Day for the Little Poor and Orphaned Kids, and Teenagers

In our church planting outreaches there are a lot of kids in these villages and towns who didn't receive any life healthy treat and are not properly cared for or given any educative fun programs. Their parents are too poor and worried on survival matters. But we can change this with an embassy of heaven.

The pastors, just to name a few; **Romulus Paraluta, Gigel Iganat, Milo Novacovici, Laurentiu Popescu, Nicu Burtea, Costel Gramada, and others**, often reminding me of this great need. We did what we could, at



least with the summer camps outreach to included most of them.

Pastor Romulus said, some parents may not be aware of this need, and ignore their child's education, but as a pastor I can't be passive or indifferent toward this new generation.

And he added, all the kids I met have this in their hearts, they are expecting it, their inside are crying for it, you don't have to explain to them what it would be like, because they already had dreams about it.

The expense of the children out program will cost about \$300, for transportation, two or three meals served, and maybe some cheap tickets, this depending what park, museum or game camp you may take them.

What takes place is kids will be saved, healed, and restored to the real life.

Let's together make this kids world a better place to live, and a life lived forever with the heavenly father.

The total project will be about \$1000, this includes most of the ministry regions, three or four children camping out projects.

Support for the Church Planting Pastors

There are several ministry leaders and pastors who are struggling with their monthly support. Presently, a couple of their wives took temporary job in western Europe country working for a couple of months to help with their family needs. This thing is not very good, and here and there some pastors go to work for extra income so they can make good through the year. They work hard to make ends meet, but the home and the church suffers when they or their wives separate to earn money.

But a \$300 a month is a monthly security to stay home, and just do the ministry for the Lord, this will not cover the whole month but with the extra income around the home, they will have enough to do the work of the Lord without leaving.

\$300 for any pastor named in the children ministry topic will help, but most of these pastors will support another team pastor under their wing.

Praise Reports are Always Present with us

We're working on fixing a couple of real poor families homes, but also we're in the process of church building. Here are some examples:

Circeni Gypsy church finished the building enlargement, and the ceiling is on.

Certejul de Sus church is fixing the old liking roof, enlarging the space and repairs.

Cornita church, is about to finish the ceiling and the floor, and now has some chairs.

Corcova Church put in the central heat stove, and extended for a children's class room.

Secu Church is continuing the building of the roof and has the windows and doors in, we hope to finish up the building and get it in use before winter as the church doesn't have a proper place to meet. They still need more funds to make this happen.

A saint family from the state of Washington helped a lot with some of these buildings, I'll tell more later when a complete praise report!
