Bowing her head down she humbly said, I come from a very little home but large family, we're seven children and our home is made of just two little rooms. We don't have a big pile of food but day by day we just get enough to eat two meals a day. Jesus takes care of us. My mother is not in good shape, she always complains of some kind of pain in her body, but we girls help her with the daily chores. I need to go back and assist her with the cooking and cleaning. However, here I do feel so blessed to hear daily about Jesus, and many miracles happen while playing and enjoy the new friends who care for nothing else but me.

### Evangelism, Church Planting and Leadership Training

After the summer camps this is a best season for evangelism and church planting outreaches. These are taking place everywhere in Romania, but mostly in the deep south that is still the most spiritually barren region of Romania. Because of material poverty there are no church buildings built or spacious public buildings to rent for gatherings, and during the warm climate the

Here is the Bethel Church testimony, planted just a few years ago, now the little poor church is building for them and their children a holy sanctuary home.

#### **Bethel Church**



The parents are saying, our kids are needing a house of God, a place where they may come into the hands of Jesus, and feel like they found the sweet home, a place where their search will end and be fulfilled and satisfied.

The village of Tintaru, Oltenia in Mehedinti county, has about 1000 dwellers, and the church today

numbers about 135 believers. About 70 percent of them are children and teenagers, a youthful harvest is in the process of reaping and gathering into God's Life store.

#### The Life Center is a Pearl of Life

If a girl or boy stays in school they can help elevate their family out from their generative poverty!

That is the meat today of the Life Center ministry in Timisoara to bring a few of these kids and elevate them to a higher level of life and then they will go back home and help their own families. They open their minds and eyes to see better life opportunities and to guide them to new economical avenues.

At this time of the year we're receiving new applicants. We're staying very busy analyzing each one's need, weighing their poverty level, and then deciding between the many new applications.

Many of these are coming from the very poor regions of Romania, officially recognized as the most economically disfavored parts of Romania. Here people are still living on a small income like in a third world country. We're weighing the total family income, and if the applicant is diligent, good standing and willing to succeed in life.

While we're drawing up final decisions, we trust God for wisdom, understanding and divine guidance for each new accepted student. We then know how to counsel and encourage the ones we could not take in.

I do ask you to join us in prayer that the Life Center support may continue and increase, praying and thanking God for the main sponsor Life Outreach International, and all of the ministry staff, volunteers and students here. Specially, praying for each applicant and for each new student accepted in the program, to be blessed and their families as well.

## In Timisoara we still continue the Street Outreach Program for the homeless.

Usually, we have about 80 street persons, children, young and old participating on each street outreach. these people are without a home or family to take them in, jobless and living from day to day. Bible School and Life Outreach students love to be involved in preparing and serving the meal, in singing to them and deliver Bible saving messages.
