Gogu and Maria Vlad and their five kids are living in Sfircea, a little town besides Bralostita where in a new church just planted they were the first to be converted to faith. Brother Gogu because of his past sinful life suffers of lung disease. He receives a small state invalidity pension, but that helps only a little with the food and no money left for clothing and shoes. Their son Gabriel was lacking winter shoes, he had only broken rubber summer sandals. As the cold season came early with snow already on the ground, his parents were concerned that he might have to skip classes at school. Gabriel was most sad and unhappy. He came to God and prayed for a pair of shoes. As the night outside was windy and snowing he even more passionately prayed for the shoe. The next morning Bishop Relu with another brother knocked at the door and stepped inside their home. They were holding a big pack in their hands, and opening it out came shoes. The most beautiful pair of shoe. They were the exact size and the best he ever put on his feet. This child's faith right on the spot was answered. Gabriel shouted with joy that God heard his prayer and sent him the shoes, while the parents wiped out tears.

Nelutu and Irina Jancu, a young family with 5 small kids, and still unsaved. Their kids age range from seven year through seven month. Pastor said, it is a sad story to behold as they still live under the past heritage curse. They are a walking distance from the church but don't dare to come in to give their lives to Christ. The church hasn't lost hope that there will be a day when their lives will be changed for ever and serve Christ. As usually when we run a bless people project to the church we include others as well.

Nelutu is a very hard working man, he is diligent and responds to any kind of work. He helps others if they need him, but if Irina his wife is not first to the money he gets, he drinks it all and what is left over is spends on games. This is inherited from his father, who was a drunkard and a poker player who committed suicide. His mom was poisoned as well, as a consequence Nelutu was an orphan since he was 12 year old. He had a rough and tough life. The mother Irina was very happy and in tears thanked us that her first grade and kindergarten kids will no longer have to go barefoot. Because of lack of shoes she carried her kids in her arms to the school.









Pastor Victor confessed to me, it is a real special visiting season of the year for him and the other leaders. The strongest fulfilling joy is to visit these kids in the midst of their own families, it is like sowing the seeds of joy around you and every seed planted shouts a joyful sound mixed with smiles and tears.

Iulica and Geta Iancu Have Eight Kids, age 1 to 14 year.

The family's only steady income is the social aid for children that is a small security just to make sure someone is not dying from hunger. The vast region around them are jobless, no hiring for regular jobs just farming in the summer but these jobs don't paid well.

Mother Geta said, her biggest burden and concern are shoes that can't be found or bought at the second hand stores. Buying new shoes for eight kids is too big a budget for them. This stressful time for her starting in the fall, she reminds her husband to work and save for the shoe. But her husband, Juliu in peace said the Lord will provide, and encouraged her not to worry but believe. The father didn't even voice their needs to the church or others. When asked he just confirms

that God is a great provider. In his home he asks the kids to pray and thank God with him for the shoes and for the food and clothing that should be provided.

Now it came the day we just went in and brought new shoes for the four kids who were in big need as every family member was bewildered. It was exactly what was needed in the home. lancu asked how we found out about their exact shoe need, was his wife the culprit? We said "no" but we found out by the other communications from God. So, Jesus gets the praises and the glory in this family and through our works for Him.

Thanks God to our dear and faithful partner, James and

Betty Robison, Life Outreach International who stands behind this Life Worthy shoe Christmas project as hundreds of little feet are warmed up and over the winter others are rescued from having frozen feet and toes and keep them out of hospital stays and toes amputation.

For the Poorest Families Packs of Food and Clothing comes with the Shoes too.

To many of these poor families who are living on the very edge, besides shoes we take them food supplies, like oil, sugar,

rice, beans, corn and wheat flower. We usually bless the little kids with sweet treats, chocolate, bananas, oranges and other stuff.

For this we thank God for the extra funding coming from some godly families from America, like Dale and Velda Clark and James and Lynnette Alexander. No donation given in love is too small. Each gift is just enough to rescue and save a little precious life on the way to a fulfilled life in Christ!
